Suzanne Gayle & Christine Pacheco from Star Arts: City of Hayward Mural Program & Process.

Star Arts is an arts studio, opened two years ago, that prides itself on working with children, teachers, schools, adults and community members on art projects, open studios, and especially mural and mosaic projects around Hayward. The studio is a place for artists to gather and teach other, too. They do small scale art, mixed media, photography, and large murals and mosaics. In spite of the economy, they have achieved their dream of community artistic projects and supporting the schools with teaching and mentorships. Murals can be public, private, interior and exterior. No mural is too small or too big to be considered. They create partnerships, and Suzanne and Christine are a great team.

Studio has art classes for children that are small in size, so kids can create their own masterpieces. They do lots of research for their art lesson plans, tying projects to history, famous artists, and whatever the kids are studying in school. They enjoy tailoring lessons to the individual classes and students. Also, seminars for teachers are held, showing them how to integrate art into their curricula. They share tips like how to use recycled materials in art projects, and give teachers a book to use to support these projects. Their community work includes street fairs, field trips, and meeting with community leaders on mural projects. The murals at Cinema Place, and on B Street, were shown and discussed. The process for creating a mural has four main steps: (1), idea to photograph; (2), photograph to sketch; (3), sketch to painting on a 1-inch to 1-foot scale; and finally (4), small scale painting to large mural. Their work was recognized in the press with an article entitled “Downtown Hayward Through Artists’ Eyes.”

Suzanne and Christine took questions from **Brian Schott** about meter box painting and graffiti abatement and cited Stacey Sorenson from the City of Hayward as a great source for more information. **George Famous** thanked them for their efforts, and suggested finding ways to engage with graffiti taggers, giving them some of the commission, to work to support art projects as a means to mitigate against the defacing and tagging of public areas. **George** saw this work with projects he was involved in, and the speakers supported those efforts. **John Hunter** asked about who picks the mural sites—it’s the City. But business owners can donate a wall of their building to the City for a project, and the City will take care of the details. **Bob Sakai** inquired, and learned, that a 3D mural (or more exact, a “trompe l’oeil”) is being created at a local elementary school. **President Rob** and the Club thanked the presenters with applause and smiles.
