Inspector Anne Madrid, HPD was introduced by **Chuck Horner**.

Inspector Madrid's expertise is financial crimes and was on hand today to make us aware of the extent of Identity Theft and ways to protect ourselves. World-wide identity theft is an industry in excess of \$200 billion - larger than the Gross Domestic Product of most countries. All of the information necessary for each of us to fall victim to this crime is already "out there" and most likely in the hands of the criminals. One in three Californians will be victimized by the bad guys. Preventive steps can be taken as well as steps to mitigate the personal losses. Anne provided an excellent handout of these techniques and they will be sent to all members via an electronic link.

Guard your personal and financial data more zealously than a stack of cash.

1. Protect your social security number – avoid carrying it on your person or in your car.
2. Avoid using a curbside mailbox or your home mailbox for outgoing mail containing checks, etc.
3. Use electronic banking.
4. Install good computer protection programs.
5. Check your credit reports at least twice a year. Better yet, subscribe to a good credit monitoring service. Best, use a "credit freeze" on all credit reporting bureaus.
6. Opt-out of marketing lists.
7. Invest in and use a cross-cut shredder.
8. Educate yourself, your children, and your employees about Cybercrime and ID Theft go to www.thinksecurityfirst.us for free online training.
